











study area:











research question:

 to assess the strength, nature and interaction of the influences on household livelihood decision-making of people dependent on natural resource utilization in rural communities adjacent to a protected area.





key responses:

- resource productivity diminishing
 - rainfall less and variable;
 - temperatures increasing
- lack of control over change / impacts
- access restrictions
- small scale economies
- lack of options wage employment
- cooperative ventures





conclusions:

- diminishing resource productivity produced short term response that increase extraction effort
- little recognition of local user impacts
- external forces external solutions
- reluctance for cooperative livelihood ventures
